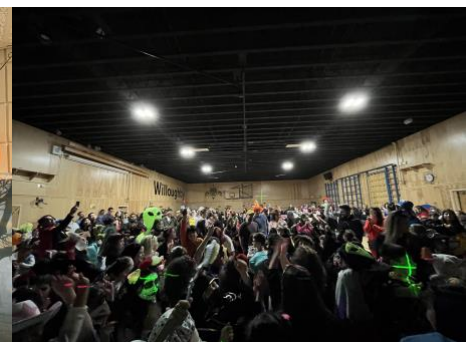

## Weekend Fuel Bag

The Langley School District Foundation provides a weekend supply of nutritious food for children when school lunch and breakfast is unavailable on a weekend or school holiday. Each food bag contains two breakfasts, two lunches, two snacks and other food items to help make it through the weekend. All food is provided to children free of charge and in a confidential manner.

Though the program is intended to help those children whose families find it difficult to have enough food for the entire month, all children are eligible for this program.
